Over the last year, Wingerworth Parish Council has seen change, challenges and success. After a tumultuous start and the reopening of the Parish Hall, we are once again focusing on the priorities of our community. Council chair, Coun Anne Knyhynyckj, reports

In the last year, the Parish Council has installed acoustic panels to improve sound quality and stop echoing around the halls. New powered doors at the rear of the building have improved wheelchair access and emergency escape.

The installation of a public defibrillator (right) provides a lifeline to our hirers and the wider community.

Very soon, the car park lighting will be replaced to prevent light intrusion into neighbouring properties and plans are in place for a new fire escape from the south of the building.
